



ABSENTEE VOTING

Can I vote absentee if I'm worried about COVID-19? YES!

Any voter concerned about COVID-19 may vote absentee in the 2020 Elections



CHECK THE BOX FOR "DISABILITY"

for COVID-19 concerns

Any voter may request an absentee ballot for the 2020 Elections based on concerns regarding COVID-19. Any voter who is concerned about COVID-19 should check the "disability" box.

FOLLOW THESE STEPS TO VOTE ABSENTEE

1. Check your registration

Make sure you're registered correctly.

2. Request your ballot!

Complete and submit your **Absentee Ballot Application** for each election to your town or city **clerk's office** by mail, email, fax, or in person.

3. Check your mail for your official ballot!

Track your absentee ballot request. It generally arrives about 30 days before the election.

4. Vote! Fill out your ballot from home.

5. Make sure to sign it!

Read the instructions carefully.

6. Return your ballot!

Make sure your ballot arrives at your town or city clerk's office before election day - mail it or drop it off in person.

YOU CAN ALSO VOTE ABSENTEE BASED ON:

Absence: You won't be in town during polling hours

Disability: You are unable to vote in person because of a disability or illness. This includes COVID-19 concerns.

Work obligation, childcare or caring for infirm adults during polling hours

Religious commitment that prevents you from appearing in public at the polls on election day

Should I really check the "disability" box for COVID-19 concerns? YES!

The NH Attorney General and Secretary of State have both said that it is legal and appropriate for ANY voter to check the box for "disability" on the absentee ballot if they are social distancing.

You don't need any documentation; your reasonable concern about COVID-19 is enough.

Note that if you can still choose to vote in person instead of returning your absentee ballot.
